At long last, we have clear direction and movement forward. After our successful defence of the Crown's motion to strike, our counsel, Umar Sheikh, has been diligently working towards a certification hearing. As I mentioned in a recent missive, we had to avail ourselves of case management to get a timeline that was reasonable.

Thankfully, the court provided a timeline, while somewhat pointedly addressing the delays. You can read that direction from the court below:

Subsequently, clear deadlines were also provided and we have targets for the next several months. These involve submitting formal affidavits from our representative plaintiffs, and the same from the crown.
